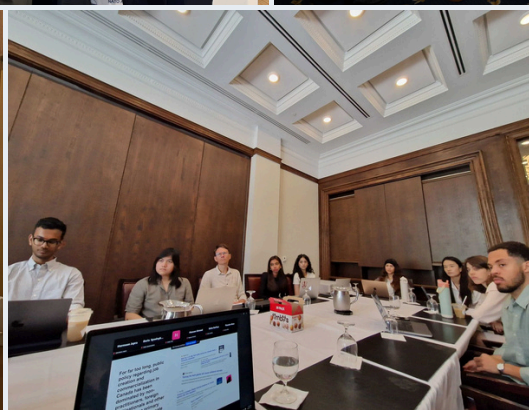

PUBLICATIONS

In 2025, the NATO Association of Canada's Publications Team published 132 articles with the mandate of helping Canadians make sense of a fast-changing security environment, at home and abroad. NATO Association publishes articles on programs including NATO and Canada, Canadian Armed Forces; Centre for Disinformation Studies; Cyber Security and Emerging Threats; Energy Security; Indo-Pacific and NATO; Security, Trade, & Economy; Society-Culture, & Security; Women in Security; Environment, Climate-Change, & Security, alongside Special Publications. Across these streams, our writers connected headline geopolitical shocks, from Russia's ongoing war against Ukraine and alliance cohesion, to Canadian domestic issues, including defence and procurement debates, Arctic sovereignty and deterrence, cyber threats to critical infrastructure, energy and supply-chain resilience, and the democratic challenge of disinformation.

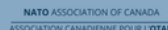

2025 Update

Curriculum

The Security in Community (SIC) Project was established in summer 2024 to develop a Massive Online Course that articulated and discussed the present and historical role of Canada in the international community.

Educator consultation, both at university-level, and at Grade 10-12 level in high schools, highlighted a general lack in understanding of Canada's role in the international community, the role of institutions significant to Canada such as NATO and the UN, the importance of civic freedoms and their link to security, and in understanding global conflict and its impact on Canadians at present, historically, and going forward.

To address this, the Security in Community project set out to develop a multimedia-format online course, adapted in a visual documentary-style format that would better hold the attention of its audiences, particularly younger Canadians. The general course was designed to target any Canadian adult interested in understanding Canada's historical, present, and future role in international governance, order, security and justice, with an abridged version of the course specially designed to be trialed and integrated within the Grade 10 Civics curriculum in Ontario, and later nationwide.

2025 has been a crucial and progress-filled year for the project, edging ever closer to our vision for a comprehensive set of educational resources, built to educate Canadians about the important role Canada has played in shaping our modern world, and the role it continues to play today.

In the early part of the year, the team had the wonderful opportunity to facilitate over 40 interviews with the project's subject-matter experts at locations all across Toronto and in Ottawa. We have then spent several months working through our extensive footage library to develop the course modules, and produce nearly 20 short videos for the NAOC's social media in the last 6 months. While a demo version of some course modules is now available (you can enroll and try the first few modules below), we look forward to finishing the course in its entirety in early 2026 and expanding our engagement with the various institutions the project has worked with as we launch the course for the public and get our materials into classrooms. We thank you all for your continued support, stay tuned for more!

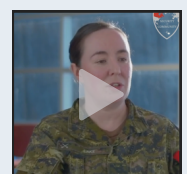
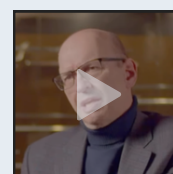
