Commodore Hans Jung is the Canadian Forces Surgeon General and commands the Canadian Forces Health Services Group, responsible for full-spectrum, high quality health care to the Canadian military in Canada and overseas. He commands over 6,000 health care professionals.

Commodore Jung joined the Canadian Forces in 1981 and completed his medical training at the University of Toronto and the Toronto East General and Orthopaedic Hospital. He was appointed to the Order of Military Merit in 2001 and promoted to his current rank in June 2009 as Director General Health Services and appointed Commander of the Canadian Forces Health Services Group/Surgeon General and Queen’s Honourary Physician
